

Child Poppy Action Plan

On the 2nd July 2020, Poppy had contacted North Yorkshire Police to report that she had been raped by four males; one of those males was under the age of 18. A Rapid Review of the case was undertaken and submitted to the National Panel with the recommendation of further examining of how the management of Young Peoples risk of sexual exploitation has changed between 2017 and now.. The National Panel agreed with the recommendation for a LSCRP to be undertaken.
