City of York Children’s Safeguarding Partnership Procedure for (CYSCP) School Audit (Section 157 and 175, Education Act 2002) and Assurance Arrangements to the City of York Safeguarding Children Partnership Executive.

1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 This document sets out the audit and assurance arrangements agreed by the Partnership in respect of schools within the City of York. The Partnership Executive has agreed the following approach in seeking assurance around safeguarding practice within the city’s schools as outlined under Sections 175 and 157 of the Education Act (2002).

2.0 City of York Safeguarding Children Partnership Approach

- 2.1 A targeted programme of Individual Safeguarding Reviews is undertaken by the School Safeguarding Advisor, who sits within the Inclusive Education Team. These reviews will also be proactively offered to schools where it is felt that there is a need/requirement due to information from risk assessments, or where potential issues arising from parental concerns, concerns raised with Ofsted/Department of Education or from partners. The reviews involve a full day site visit, with a detailed report being produced containing recommendations and actions. A copy of the report is also retained by the Local Authority for oversight and assurance. Schools are then supported by the School Safeguarding Advisor as needed to implement the recommendations. Reviews for City of York Schools are prioritised and support with reviews are offered to schools in Multi Academy Trusts and Independent Schools. Reviews are comprehensive and focus on key areas including:

- The management of safeguarding
- Training
- Safer recruitment
- Safeguarding policies and procedures
- Filtering and monitoring and online safety
- Site security
- Behaviour management and use of restrictive intervention
- Child on Child abuse
- Attendance and Children Missing Education
- Record keeping
- Multi-agency working
- Working with school communities to keep children safe
- Student voice

2.2 Risk assessments for schools are undertaken by the Inclusive Education team, City of York Council on an ongoing basis, which identify whether any safeguarding support is needed. These are informed by regular contact between schools and their allocated advisor, with Multi-Academy Trusts (MAT), and by undertaking school monitoring visits/meetings. The School Safeguarding Advisor will respond to any support needs identified as part of this assessment.

3.0 Governance

3.1 The School Safeguarding Advisor will continue to contribute to multi-agency audits as specified by the City of York Safeguarding Children Partnership, and engage with schools in the dissemination of learning from these and from individual Case Reviews.

The School safeguarding Advisor will provide annual assurance updates to the Partnership Executive regarding safeguarding in schools, which will summarise safeguarding activity undertaken in schools and identify any themes and specific safeguarding concerns raised through audit and by colleagues in schools.
